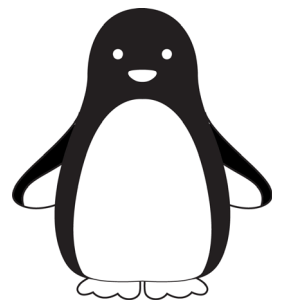

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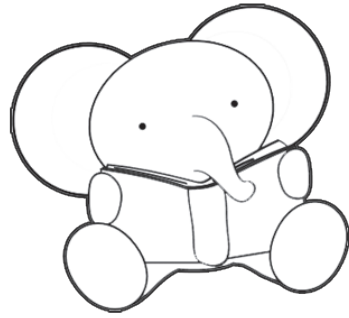

Who Can Participate?

All children from birth until the beginning of Kindergarten
with a Naperville Public Library card

How Does It Work?

- Color in a space on the reading log for every book read together.
- Any reading or listening counts – count books read aloud by a parent, caregiver, sibling, or anyone else.
- Count a book each time it's read, even if it's repeated.
- Count books read at storytime.
- When the log is completed, bring it to the Children's Desk at any Naperville Public Library for a sticker.
- When all ten logs are completed, the child's name will be placed on a bookplate in a library book.
- Have fun reading!

Early Literacy Tip

Reading together with your child regularly is the most effective way to build early literacy skills. Allowing your child to pick which book to read together helps to get him or her excited about reading.
