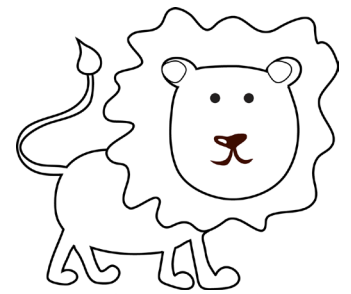

Who Can Participate?

All children from birth until the beginning of Kindergarten
with a Naperville Public Library card

How Does It Work?

- Color in a space on the reading log for every book read together.
- Any reading or listening counts – count books read aloud by a parent, caregiver, sibling, or anyone else.
- Count a book each time it's read, even if it's repeated.
- Count books read at storytime.
- When the log is completed, bring it to the Children's Desk at any Naperville Public Library for a sticker.
- When all ten logs are completed, the child's name will be placed on a bookplate in a library book.
- Have fun reading!

Early Literacy Tip

Reading is a great way to build vocabulary because books often have a wider variety of words than regular conversation. Explain unfamiliar words; talk about colors, shapes, sizes, feelings, and other concepts.
