- Prizes can be redeemed between June 10 - August 15.

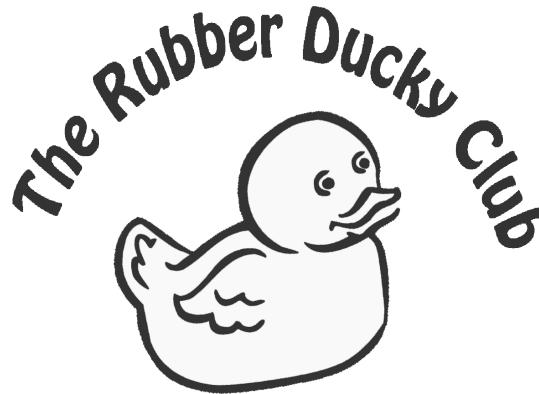

What is Early Literacy and why is it important?

Research consistently demonstrates that the more children know about language and literacy before they begin formal schooling, the better equipped they are to succeed in reading.

Early Literacy is not the teaching of reading. Early Literacy is encouraging your child to love language and books, and most of all to have fun!

Key Early Literacy activity practices to get children ready to read.

- Holding your child while you look at a book and talking to him or her about the pictures.
- Singing silly songs and saying nursery rhymes.
- Playing peek-a-boo or other games.
- Telling stories and letting your child "write" with his or her crayons.
- Reading or telling stories in the language you are most comfortable with.

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
